A. Guest Series: Getting to Know Candidates

Katy Young Yaroslavsky — Candidate, Council District 5, introduced herself as a climate and environmental attorney, policy expert, mom; worked for Supervisor Kuehl on sustainability, environment and arts.

B. CD 5 Update — Daniel Skolnick/Ali Simard

Ali Simard: Redistricting will come to council next week. Climate Change is a big issue. Today Council voted unanimously to seek carbon neutrality by 2030. Cool Block sign ups: https://www.ncsa.la/cool_blocks_la

Ridgeline Ordinance - CD 5 will do a windshield survey to verify that map is accurate.

A. Mount St. Mary's University Project — Wendy-Sue Rosen/Mark Stratton

Recommended by Planning Department. They do not have secondary access evacuation. The state requires a minimum roadway of 20 feet. The Federation sent a letter opposing the project as proposed.

B. Curtis School - Mark Stratton

They are trying to get a vague master plan approved. They want to double the amount of classrooms and say they won't increase enrollment. Curtis is piece-mealing its expansion.

C. Mulholland Design Review Board Memorandum — Don Andres

Our attorney John Given met with city to set trial date on June 29, 2022 for hearing on the merits of the writ. He has identified nine projects that he thinks have wrongly skipped MDRB oversight. The Sierra Club started a petition campaign with 570 letters so far.

D. SB 9 and 10 Update — Wendy-Sue Rosen

The bills become law in January, 2022. Minimum road standards might be one way to exempt hillsides.

E. Redistricting

Lots of communities have been divided; anything can happen at City Council.
